About Jim Davis!

Jim Davis is Garfield's creator. He was born on July 28, 1945, in Marion, Indiana. Jim grew up on a small farm near Fairmount, Indiana. He used his family as characters in the Garfield comic strip, they were Jon Arbuckle's family.

As a child Jim Davis was forced to stay in bed a lot and away from farm chores because of asthma. In an effort to keep occupied, Jim Davis used to draw, learning the basics of good drawing from his mother. During his childhood Jim Davis loved to read the Sunday comics, and counts the classic strips like "Peanuts" and "Beetle Bailey" as very influential to his cartooning career.

His first comic strip was called "Gnorm Gnat" it ran weekly in a Indiana newspaper for five years. After a lot of hard work and time Jim Davis came up with the idea of Garfield. Since then Garfield has gone on to be a worldwide success.
